solutions.

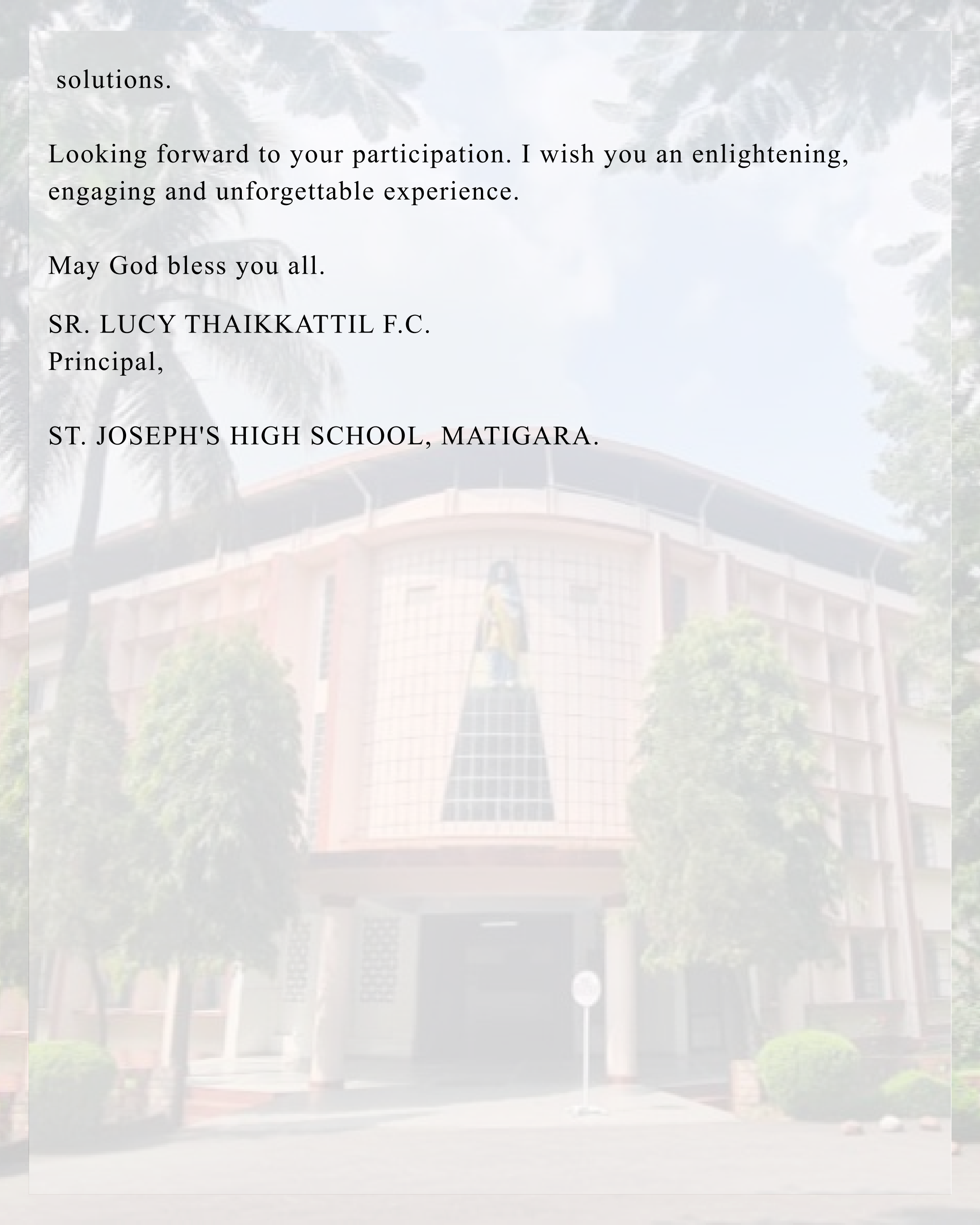

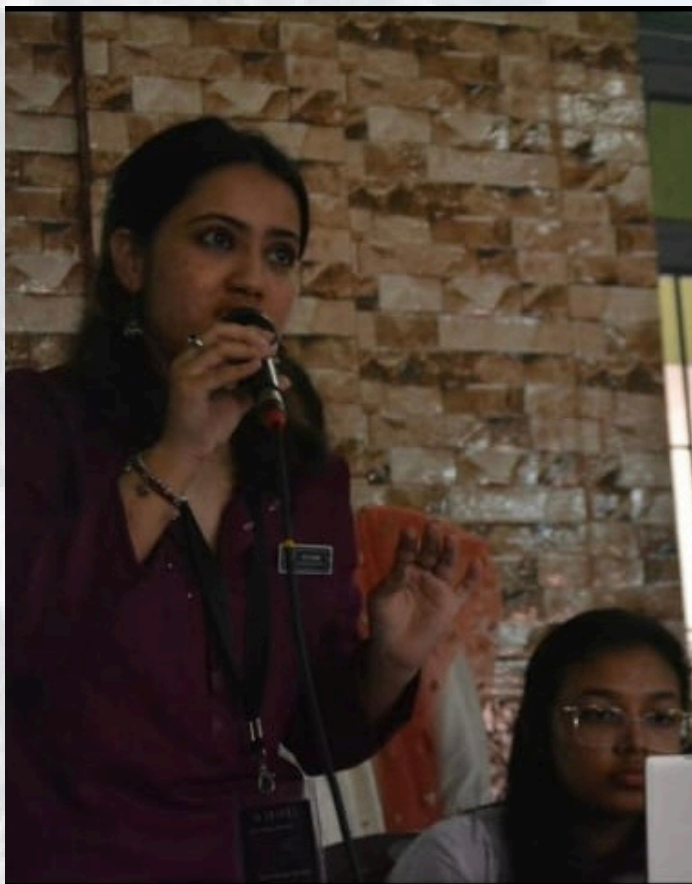
## **EX JOSEPHITE ANMOL SHARMA SPEAKER**

## **ABOUT THE COMMITTEE**

ECOSOC (the United Nations Economic and Social Council) is one of the six main organs of the United Nations. It is responsible for promoting international economic and social cooperation and development. ECOSOC is composed of 53 member states that are elected by the General Assembly for three-year terms. ECOSOC promotes sustainable economic and social development. It also provides a forum for discussing and addressing global economic and social issues. ECOSOC formulates policy recommendations and develops international conventions and agreements on a wide range of economic and social issues, such as poverty reduction, gender equality, and environmental sustainability. Overall, ECOSOC plays a critical role in advancing global economic and social development and promoting international cooperation and coordination to address some of the world's most pressing challenges.

# COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF WOMEN



## **ABOUT THE COMMITTEE**

The United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (UNCSW) is a key body of the United Nations dedicated to promoting gender equality and empowering women across the world. In a Model United Nations (MUN), the UNCSW committee focuses on discussing and resolving global issues related to women's rights, such as gender-based violence, unequal access to education, economic inequality, and discrimination in workplaces. Delegates represent different countries and debate policies based on their nation's stance, working collaboratively to draft resolutions that propose practical and impactful solutions. The committee typically follows a structured format including formal speeches, moderated and unmoderated caucuses, and resolution writing, allowing participants to develop skills like public speaking, research, negotiation, and diplomacy. UNCSW is considered one of the more engaging and relatable committees, as it deals with real-world social issues, encouraging delegates to combine logical reasoning with empathy while suggesting realistic and implementable policies.

## **ABOUT THE COMMITTEE**

The Lok Sabha, constitutionally the House of the People, is the lower house of India's bicameral Parliament, with the upper house being the Rajya Sabha. Members of the Lok Sabha are elected by an adult universal suffrage and a first-past-the-post system to represent their respective constituencies and they hold their seats for five years or until the body is dissolved by the president on advice of the council of ministers. The house meets in the Lok Sabha chambers of the Sansad Bhawan, New Delhi. The Lok Sabha is an important institution of the Indian democratic republic system, as it represents the voice of the people and plays a crucial role in shaping the country's future.

## **“ASSESSING THE ROLE OF TRADE DISRUPTIONS, SANCTIONS, AND FINANCIAL SYSTEMS IN DRIVING GLOBAL INFLATION AND THE COST OF LIVING CRISIS.”**

This agenda is about understanding why prices are rising all over the world and how it affects people's daily lives. Global inflation means that things like food, fuel, and clothes are becoming more expensive. One reason for this is trade disruptions, which happen when goods cannot move easily between countries due to problems like wars, natural disasters, or pandemics. This reduces supply and increases prices. Another factor is sanctions, where countries place restrictions on others, limiting trade and access to important resources. This can also make products more costly. The financial system, which includes banks, interest rates, and money flow, also plays a role. For example, when interest rates rise, borrowing becomes expensive, and businesses may increase prices to cover costs. All these factors together lead to to cover costs. All these factors together lead to a cost of living crisis, meaning people find it harder to afford basic needs. This agenda helps us study these causes and find solutions so that life becomes more affordable for everyone.

## **“WOMEN IN CONFLICT ZONES: EXAMINING FAILURES IN PROTECTION, PATTERNS OF EXPLOITATION, AND POLITICAL INTERESTS”**

The agenda highlights the serious challenges faced by women in areas affected by war and violence. Conflict zones are regions where political instability and armed struggles disrupt normal life, making women especially vulnerable. One of the biggest issues is the lack of proper protection, as laws are either weak or not effectively implemented, leaving women unsafe even in refugee camps. In such conditions, many women face exploitation, including sexual violence, human trafficking, and forced labor. Disturbingly, at times even those responsible for providing aid and security misuse their power. Another major concern is the role of political interests, where countries often prioritize power and control over humanitarian needs, resulting in delayed or insufficient action. This situation not only violates basic human rights but also affects global peace and stability. It is important for the international community to work together to create stronger laws, ensure accountability, and provide support systems like education, healthcare, and legal assistance. Through the efforts of bodies like the Commission on the Status of Women, meaningful steps can be taken to protect women and promote equality even in the most difficult circumstances.

Furthermore, awareness and education play a crucial role in addressing these issues, as informed communities are better able to prevent abuse and support victims. Empowering women through skill development and economic opportunities can help them rebuild their lives and reduce dependency in crisis situations. Strong coordination between governments, international organizations, and local communities is essential to ensure long term solutions and sustainable peace.

## **“DELIBERATION ON ELECTORAL REFORMS IN INDIA, WITH EMPHASIS ON ONE NATION, ONE ELECTION AND SIR.”**

Deliberation on electoral reforms in India means discussing ways to improve how elections are conducted so they become fair, simple, and efficient. One important idea is One Nation, One Election, which suggests that all elections in India—like for Parliament and State Assemblies—should be held at the same time. This can save money, reduce frequent campaigning, and help the government focus more on development work instead of elections happening again and again. Another concept is SIR (Special Intensive Revision), which is about carefully updating the voter list to make sure it is correct. This means removing wrong names and adding new eligible voters so that everyone who has the right to vote can do so properly. These reforms aim to make elections more transparent, organized, and trustworthy. By discussing these ideas, leaders try to find better ways to strengthen democracy in India, ensuring that every citizen's vote is counted fairly and the system works smoothly for everyone. While reforms like “One Nation, One Election” aim to improve efficiency, they also raise concerns. Conducting simultaneous elections across India may reduce focus on regional issues, as national narratives can dominate. Smaller and regional parties may struggle to campaign effectively at both levels, giving an advantage to larger parties. An agenda that sparks critical discussion on power, representation, and reform—perfect for a compelling debate.
